Timothy L. Schroeder

August 2007 - Present: Mr. Schroeder has been employed with Scientific Application International Corporation (SAIC) as the Senior Security Polygraph Analyst who serves as the lead technical contract expert for the National Geospatial Intelligence Agency (NGA) Polygraph Program. He conducts CI scope polygraph examinations, supervises six (6) contractor examiners and three (3) administrative specialists. He has conducted over 1,000 CI scope examinations using applicable testing techniques to include TES, MGQT, ZOC and R/I. Subjects of polygraph testing include government, military and contractor employees many of whom are high ranking individuals. He is assigned the most sensitive re-test examinations and security interviews. He also provides CI polygraph briefings to new employees.

July 1987 - July 2007: Mr. Schroeder served as a special agent, polygraph examiner, supervisor/manager, and program manager with the Defense Criminal Investigative Service (DCIS), the criminal investigative arm of the DoD Office of Inspector General (DoDIG). As the Assistant Deputy Director, Operations Directorate, Headquarters, DCIS, he managed the following programs: Polygraph, Technical Services, Firearms, Records Management, Environmental Crimes, Health Care Fraud, Financial Crimes, Coordination of Remedies, Product Substitution, and Computer Crimes. As the Program Manger, Polygraph, he conducted and supervised hundreds of polygraph examinations in support of complex fraud (white collar crime) investigations. The DCIS Polygraph Program successfully passed three (3) Defense Academy and Credibility Assessment (DoDPI) inspections under his supervision.

February 1967 - July 1987: Mr. Schroeder served on active duty in the US Army retiring as a Chief Warrant Officer (W-4). During 18 years of his career, he served as a special agent with the US Army CID Command (USACIDC) responsible for investigating felony crimes. During the last twelve (12) years, he was a certified DoD/USACIDC polygraph examiner. He also served three (3) years as a polygraph instructor at the US Army Polygraph School where he taught polygraph, interview/interrogations to federal agents from DoD and federal agencies. He also taught VIP security and counter-terrorism measures. During his last three (3) years, he served as the Chief, Polygraph Quality Control Office, where he was responsible for the technical supervision of about thirty (30) examiners worldwide and the review of about 10,000 examinations.
